
At Element we believe it is important for people around us to understand the changes that are taking place in our own lives' based on the work of Christ in us. To help others understand what Baptism is and what it means to those being baptized on a personal level, we have asked them to share their life and stories with you, those attending and those online, in a more personal way than maybe you are use to.

In Baptism we are making a making a public statement about our life and commitment to walk in the ways Jesus calls us. Many people only get the Jesus "as seen on TV" and don't understand what Jesus does in "real life" or what following Him looks like on a practical level. Baptism is not magical, but it is a deeply spiritual event that reflects the work Jesus has done in our lives. The act of Baptism is symbolic in that we identify with the death and resurrection of Christ. We are essentially being buried (by going under the water) and raised to walk in new life (by coming out of the water).

The entire point is public identification with Christ and His work within us. That He is our great God and savior that has come to restore a broken humanity that cannot have a relationship with God on our own. He is the Redeemer, He is the Remedy, He is the Hope, and He is our Life.

We also have the hope that one day you too will come to the saving knowledge of trusting in Jesus with your life. It makes all the difference in the world.

Candice Fleming

...so I got on my knees before God and asked for His help. I have been drug free since that moment...

My name is Candice Fleming. My story begins 28 years ago in Hawaii; I was born in Kahlua (it's pronounced just like it is written). My dad was a Marine, and we moved a few times while growing up.

We moved to Oceanside after Hawaii, and after my parents' divorce, I ended up in Orange County. When I was 12, we moved to Lompoc, and at 16 I essentially took care of myself after my mother died.

There are a lot of details of my story that are very hard to share, so I will not go into all of them. My history, as so many others, is full of a lot of pain and hurt. I have done a lot of running away from the Lord, and I always seem to come right back to Him. Every time I run away and do things on my own I end up messing everything up, Jesus ALWAYS brings me right back to Him and HE does miracles again in my life.

Every obstacle I have faced, I have prayed for His guidance and help, and He has helped above and beyond, always getting me out of that hole I have dug myself into. For 28 Yrs. I have lived off self-will; I am very tired of it. I am done. God keeps proving to me that I will be all right if I just rely on Him.

At one point I could have lost my child or even ended up in prison; so I got on my knees before God and asked for His help. I have been drug free since that moment. My past has led me into a drug rehabilitation program. That program is actually how I came to Element, a housemother where I live attends Element and introduced me.

At this point in my life, I have surrendered all of me to Jesus. He sought me and loved me and has called me home. I am now choosing to live as Christ would have me live rather than the way I have lived in past.

This day I am here, not to prove anything to myself (or to my husband, or my son), but to my Father in Heaven that I am ready to live HIS WILL. I am ready to be the Daughter He put me here to be, the Mother I need to be and the Wife I vowed to be. I am ready to do His will and to walk in His light the rest of my Life.

I like that Element has us write our stories (even though it is very hard) because I would like you to know that, if you are struggling through something you think is impossible to get away from, Jesus offers hope and the restoration of true life. New life truly is possible. Jesus longs to lead all of us into freedom, and that is what baptism represents today; I am dead to my old life and alive to my new life in Christ.

Erica Erskine

...my relationship with Jesus is what saw me through. I pray for, and have forgiven, all the people who have tried to hurt me.

My name is Erica Erskine, and it is a great joy to tell you my story (it is much longer than what you will read here, so if you want to know more please feel free to ask me).

I was born in Gdansk on the Polish side of the German border in the 1950's. At that time, Poland was under communist influence. It was a very hard life for everyone there. Our community was very small, so small in fact that it only accepted one type of faith: The Catholic faith. When I was one year old, I was baptized according to the practices of the Catholic Church.

I followed the tenants of the faith, I practiced what I was taught, but I never experienced true grace. No matter what I did, I felt like I was still destined for hell. I grew up with a horrible home and school life. I am not trying to complain and be the victim, but almost everyone in my life has hurt me…except for Jesus.

During all of the worst of times growing up, my relationship with Jesus is what saw me through. I pray for, and have forgiven, all the people who have tried to hurt me.

When I was in my teens, I immigrated to the United States. I first lived in Chicago, Illinois. While in Chicago, I would occasionallyattendachurch,butIneverfoundanyplacethatIcould call my own (or what I felt could be home). I was alone, but never actually felt alone because God was and is always with me; He never left me. I could always talk to Him and that made me stronger.

These same feelings continued when, over twenty years ago, I moved to California. I moved so many times that it became

virtually impossible to ever find a church to truly belong to and call home. I have now lived in Santa Maria for the past three years.

I have never blamed Jesus for any of the bad that has happened in my life; I truly believe he used everything to help me to have stronger faith. I even became a nurse (though I no longer am one) because I wanted to help people.

I used to, periodically, pass by a building with a big sign that said "Element," but never knew it was a church. One Sunday, when I was walking my dog, I was surprised to see the building full of people. The next Sunday I attended the services, everyone was so friendly (that would be you as the parishioners) and the message spoke to me so much that I have attended service every Sunday since.

A lot of people have the one moment that they gave their life to Jesus, for me it has simply been a continual process. I have loved Him for as long as I can remember and want to live my life loving and serving Him more.

When the subject of baptism came up, I decided that this is the church I would like to become a part of. I know baptism is not a magical formula that will fix everything in my life, but I do feel that this special event will give me a sense of a new lease on life. I want to daily grow closer to God through His Son Jesus Christ. What more can a person desire?

I hope that God will also use me, and my unique experiences, to help me be an asset to the body of the Christ.

My name is Daniel Keinert and I am fourteen years old (I turn fifteen on March 31).

I know a lot of people have a certain day and time that they remember dedicating their lives to Jesus, but for me I don't remember a certain day, or time...I have just always believed. I am not saying I was born a Christian, I know that is not how it works, but for a long as I can remember I have basically believed in Jesus.

Hello everyone, my name is Gil and this is my story.

As a young child my father died from Leukemia, there was a lot of pain involved on his side for having the disease and my side in losing my father. As I grew up and became a preteen the pain still followed so I began to find comfort in mind-altering substances.

Through many hardships I found myself in jail, again, at the age of 35 years old. With an extensive police record (7 drunk driving and 3 under the influence of a controlled substance charges) I was a mess addicted to drugs.

That was March 25, 2000. I cried out to Jesus for the first time in my life, asking Him to help me. I even challenged Him to do something I thought He couldn't do, which in retrospect is funny. 3 days later, I was shocked and scared because He did it...I promised Him I would stop doing drugs as a result of His goodness. But now I did not know how to do that. So, I cried out to Him again and asked Him to help me, but most importantly, to never leave me. I said that over and over for a couple of hours while crying in my bunk in jail.

It was then that I felt His spirit and I knew that everything was going to be okay. The day I was arrested, March 25, 2000, was the last time I ever used any drugs or alcohol to change the way I feel on the inside.

Today, I know God lives in me. 2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has gone, the new has come." The Lord has brought me to my knees, and He

has blessed me.

When I was released from jail I only had a nice pair of shoes to my name. Today, I have many Earthly things that mean nothing, even though I enjoy them. I know God can take it all away; but without Him in my life, I am nothing but a lost soul.

For the last 5 years I have been reading my bible every morning. Then I get on my knees and pray. Prayer and meditation is the key. A whole new world has opened up to me. I am a modern day disciple.

I have never been baptized in water and Jesus has put it on my heart to do so, that is why I am here today.

I now minister to teens at a teen retreat. I also minister to adults as well. My bible tells me about the cleansing of sin with water and that baptism is a way to show others that I am a new creation in Christ. So, I must lead by example.

I came to Element because I was looking for a church and the bible states I need to belong to a church. I saw Element for a long time and thought it was a skate shop (yes, that's funny).
