WHY?


At Element we believe it is important for people around us to understand the changes that are taking place in our own lives' based on the work of Christ in us. To help others understand what Baptism is and what it means to those being baptized on a personal level, we have asked them to share their life and stories with you, those attending and those online, in a more personal way than maybe you are use to.

In Baptism we are making a public statement about our life and commitment to walk in the ways Jesus calls us. Many people only get the Jesus "as seen on TV" and don't understand what Jesus does in "real life" or what following Him looks like on a practical level. Baptism is not magical, but it is a deeply spiritual event that reflects the work Jesus has done in our lives. The act of Baptism is symbolic in that we identify with the death and resurrection of Christ. We are essentially being buried (by going under the water) and raised to walk in new life (by coming out of the water).

The entire point is public identification with Christ and His work within us. That He is our great God and savior that has come to restore a broken humanity that cannot have a relationship with God on our own. He is the Redeemer, He is the Remedy, He is the Hope, and He is our Life.

We also have the hope that one day you too will come to the saving knowledge of trusting in Jesus with your life. It makes all the difference in the world.

Hi! My name is Sydney, and I am 17 years old. I was born and raised here in Santa Maria, CA and have loved every minute of it. I started attending Element when it first opened several years ago. I loved it because Aaron, all the leadership, and all the members always made me feel welcome and comfortable.

I grew up in a large Christian family and always felt loved and supported. I have never had a traumatic event in my life or remember a specific time that I decided to seek God. On the other hand, He has always been a part of my childhood and family life, and He has been seeking me.

My parents forced me to go to church every week, sent me to Sunday School, church camps, and Christian school. I learned all of the "information" about Jesus, but didn't fully comprehend the true meaning of being a Christian. I acted perfect at church, in school, and at home, but didn't really live my life focused on God.

As I grew older, I thought more about Christ, but wanted the decision to follow Him to be MY decision and NOT my parents. It was important that my decision be my own based on my relationship with Him, and not because anyone was pressuring me.

Over time all the Biblical lessons that I learned from my family, camp, school, and Sunday School began to make sense in a way that I could understand. Instead of just knowing the facts in my head, I now believe it in my heart. I can see the meaning behind the Bible stories and try to apply them to my everyday life.

Since surrendering to Jesus, accepting Christ into my heart, I feel more peace. I appreciate more things and take less for granted. I feel like I have a purpose on this earth and a better understanding of that purpose as a Christian. I am really excited to follow God's plan for me.

My name is Rudy van Solinge. I am 59 years old and surrendered my life to Jesus as my Savior on December 23, 2011. It took a while for me to "come to Jesus," but I know that God has been active in my life all along. My spirituality has been a bit of a puzzle and finding Jesus (or Him finding me) was the last piece. He changed my life so I could approach life Christ-centered instead of me trying to be in control all the time. This is my story.

I grew up in a very close but secular family. My father was a strong personality and was an agnostic. Even though he was an agnostic he was still active in the church in Holland before the family immigrated to the USA. His heart became hardened to God when my sister died from a tragic accident at four years old (I was three at the time). He remained hardened to God till the day of his death. The elders in his church blamed my parents for my sister's death. They said it was their lack of church attendance that God brought about the tragedy. My mother was a loving wife and acknowledged and supported my father's views about religion. She believes in God and Jesus, but I'm not sure as to her true commitment.

My parents came as immigrants to the US for new opportunities and a better life for their sons. My dad worked incredibly hard and established his own business; he was successful in very short amount of time. His work ethic was passed on to me as I lived my life's journey in going to school, sports, marriage and my career. I have been very blessed in finding a loving supportive wife of 34 years, having 2 good kids, running a business, and a beautiful home.

For most of my life, I was an agnostic like my father, with a belief in God (and that Jesus was a great guy) but could not get my arms around the fact that He was the "only guy." We went to church once a year at Christmas, but it was an event for the kids and felt a bit hypocritical about it. I led a moral life, although a self centered one, I even put my

kids in Christian school so they could make their own decision as to their faith.

But, and this is a big but, I always felt that there was more to life and searched for spirituality in modern new age thinking. For me that meant that you experience what you believe and that you are the source of all thought and you create the reality of your beliefs.

I was happy. Why would I want to change? In the fall of 2011, I was watching an interview on TV of an author, Richard M. Eyre, who wrote a book "The Three Deceivers". It really piqued my interest, so I ordered it. I remember to this day sitting in the car in the rain at a horse event of my daughters, and I was immersed in this book. He explained his view of the three deceivers; control, ownership, and independence. The idea was that we all want to aspire to have a high level of all three, but who really has control? Who really owns all? Who really created us to be interdependent with all around us? GOD!

A dear friend of my wife, Kitty, had given us Rick Warren's book "The Purpose Driven Life" which I had started reading. On Dec 23rd, I was reading chapter 7, The Reason For Everything. I read the following paragraph;

"Right now, God is inviting you to live for His glory by fulfilling the purpose He made for you. It's really the only way to live. Everything else is just existing. Real life begins by committing yourself completely to Jesus Christ. If you are not sure you have done this, all you have to do is receive and believe. The bible promises, "To all who received Him, to those who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God." Will you accept God's offer?

I became very emotional and started crying. I had reached the pivot point of my life. God had been calling me, so I surrendered. I received and I believed and Jesus Christ came into my life as my Lord and Savior. I called Kitty and confessed my commitment to Jesus.

The search for a church then stared, the first being Kitty's in Pismo (that's a drive). A friend of ours had told us about Element, so on January14th, we visited. That Sunday was the first Sunday of the first sermon of the Genesis series and I knew I was in the right place. Genesis is that book of beginnings, and I think maybe God's plan for me was to start in the beginning. I took communion as an affirmation of God's work in me and the start of my Christian life.

He put me in kindergarten at Element to begin to learn about the word of God, about Jesus and the Holy Spirit, about the Bible, and the role of a church in a person's life. I still struggle every day. Becoming a Christian was one of the hardest things I have ever done. But there is hope, even for knuckleheads like me.
