

WHY STORY?

At Element we believe it is important for people around us to understand the changes that are taking place in our own lives based on the work of Christ in us. To help others understand what Baptism is and what it means to those being baptized on a personal level, we have asked them to share their life and stories with you, those attending and those online, in a more personal way than maybe you are use to.

In Baptism we are making a public statement about our life and commitment to walk in the ways Jesus calls us. Many people only get the Jesus "as seen on TV" and don't understand what Jesus does in "real life" or what following Him looks like on a practical level. Baptism is not magical, but it is a deeply spiritual event that reflects the work Jesus has done in our lives. The act of Baptism is symbolic in that we identify with the death and resurrection of Christ. We are essentially being buried (by going under the water) and raised to walk in new life (by coming out of the water).

The entire point is public identification with Christ and His work within us. That He is our great God and Savior that has come to restore a broken humanity that cannot have a relationship with God on our own. He is the Redeemer, He is the Remedy, He is the Hope, and He is our Life.

We also have the hope that one day you too will come to the saving knowledge of trusting in Jesus with your life. It makes all the difference in the world.

DANNY MAHER

My name is Danny Maher. I was born in Simi Valley in 1971 and baptized as a Catholic. I have been a believer in Jesus for as long as I can remember and have enjoyed God's influence in my life, but still felt like something was missing, until last year.

I was raised in Orcutt in a pretty normal family, the middle child of three boys, some might say we were boring. Not much drama, just school, sports, friends, etc. As I said, I was raised Catholic and went so far as to take my first communion. At some point, however, my parents decided we didn't need church in our lives any longer, and that was that.

Now fast forward to 1990. I had moved to Santa Rosa to go to school, but God had other plans. I landed a job at a local market/delicatessen where I thought I was hired for my experience in grocery. I found out later I was hired because the manager thought I was cute and would make a great companion for one of the girls who also worked there. It turns out, after nearly 22 years of marriage, she was right, at least about the great companion part anyway.

When my wife and I were preparing for our wedding, we needed a pastor. A friend recommended his, so we met with him, began attending his church and were married shortly thereafter. As time passed, however, we began to see this pastor in a different light. Without getting into detail, we decided to move on. We tried another church on the advice of a friend. We arrived a little late one Sunday morning, and could hear the singing as we approached the church doors. When we walked in, we were quite stunned. There were people dancing in the aisles, arms in the air, some kneeling on the floor, some were crying, some were laughing, it was like nothing we had ever seen, or were prepared for. I'm sure it was amazing for them, but a little advanced for us. We didn't go back.

Although I continued to do some light research into different religions, I had resigned myself to the fact that I really didn't need "church." I had convinced myself that churches only wanted my money,

(ha, MY money), and I could talk to God anywhere. After my kids were born, I wanted them to know God, but again decided we didn't need church. I figured I could tell them about God, and they could decide which religion to follow when they became adults.

It was around 2000 when I began to feel something was missing. It was this strange feeling like I was on the verge of something but didn't know what. In 2002 I entered the CHP academy. I found a friend in another cadet who lived in Atascadero, and began commuting with him to Sacramento every weekend for the next 26 weeks. This was a very difficult time in our lives and I derived my strength from my family. I found he received his from his strong Christian faith. We had some pretty deep religious conversations on our long journeys back and forth in those six months. He recommended The Message bible to me, and I bought it along with a teen bible for my eldest and a one-year children's bible for my youngest. He also introduced me to the band MercyMe whom I grew to thoroughly enjoy. I have always been a fan of all music, even country, and already had a few Christian albums.

Now you may be wondering, is there a point to this? Why does this matter? I'm getting there, stay with me. In fact, I'll skip ahead, because the next 12 years goes along pretty much the same way. Something's still missing. The signs were there, but I failed to pick up on them. At one point, about four years ago, my eldest son said he had heard about this church called Element, and thought we should check it out. Another sign I failed to acknowledge. I told him I wasn't sure about a church in an old car lot with a name like Element, boy was I wrong. I then took a new position at work about two years ago, and it seemed everyone in my office was a believer. They would talk about the Dave Ramsey program, and one gentleman even took to reading aloud out of the book of Psalms during coffee a few days a week. I was becoming curious.

Now part of my job as a Public Information Officer with the CHP is to attend the Mid-State Fair every year and set up a booth where we can

talk to folks about recruitment, safety programs, answer general traffic related questions, and provide a little security. I was happy last year when I learned MercyMe was going to be at the fair and made sure I was working that night. That evening I was working with my sergeant (also a Christian), and when the concert began, we closed up our booth and headed over. I will never forget it, when we walked into the venue just as they were singing "The Hurt & the Healer." In the middle of the song, the lead singer began preaching about his trials and struggles and how, he became lost for a time, wondering if what he was doing was enough and how could he do more for God. I was hanging on every word. At that moment, with the music playing, the singer preaching, I felt as though Jesus was reaching out to me. I finally got it, it all made sense, it clicked. And I suddenly found myself, in full police uniform, with my Sergeant and hundreds of people standing nearby, wiping tears from my face and the inability to make it stop. I was saved by Jesus, truly saved.

After that night, my wife and I both decided to really live for Jesus in our lives and truly bring Him into our home. We spoke with our eldest son, in the Marine Corps, and learned that he too had surrendered his life to Jesus while in boot camp. It seems Jesus was chasing our whole family down at the same time.

I connected, with a now very good friend, at work who has helped to guide my path. He recommended I find a church, and only one popped into my head. So when my eldest returned home from boot camp, our family found a home at Element and we have been thanking the Lord together ever since.

My name is Sasha Maher. I was born in Oceanside Ca, and was raised in Santa Rosa. Some of my earliest memories of childhood are centered on going to church. So to say that I was raised in the church would be an accurate statement, but I can honestly say, now as an adult, I didn't ever seem to understand why we went.

I thought I knew who God was and that Jesus had "died for our sins," but when I was 17 years old, my youth pastor asked our youth group to explain just why we celebrated Easter. I was absolutely stumped. After all those years going to church, I discovered I knew very little about the Bible or about Jesus. To say I was embarrassed would be an understatement.

In 1990 I met Danny, who quickly became my very best friend and my husband only year and a half later. We were the first of our friends to get married and, for quite a few years, the only couple we knew having children. In 1996 we welcomed our first son Jonah and in 2000, we welcomed our second son Jakob. These two are the light of our lives. The Lord truly blessed us with amazing children.

We told our children about God, taught them right from wrong, but never made "church" a priority in our lives. We just felt that we could teach them ourselves and pray at home and that would be perfectly ok. Although it may not have been the best decision, I no longer regret it because I know now God had had a plan for us all along; He wanted us to come to Him when it was His time, and our time...AND what a GLORIOUS time it is!

I will forever remember listening to our oldest son Jonah say he had accepted The Lord Jesus Christ as his savior. It brings tears to my eyes even now remembering that phone call. That was the moment all our hearts were waiting for, the place Jesus was leading us all to. I was telling our Gospel Community (our amazingly wonderful, awesome GC) how we had always led a happy loving life, but it's just somehow

I simply wanted to end my misery and pain, I figured ending my life was the easiest way to make that happen.

I believed I had nothing to live for and nothing to look forward to, my whole family life was turned upside down when my dad left. Thankfully my wonderful Aunt and Uncle, Bea & Jason never stopped reaching out to me. They have always been a part of my life, loving me, welcoming me as part of their own. They would always talk to me about what was going on in my life, they showed genuine concern because they truly cared. I knew they prayed for me. They'd talk about Jesus and what He had done in their lives and in their family. They invited me to church and I started to go with them.

Up to this point, I would say Jesus was always there, but I didn't know Him. Going to church services, hearing what an amazing God He is, caused me to start praying and talking to Him. Then I went to Teen Search over Thanksgiving Break, which is a camp like Young Life. It was there where God truly revealed Himself to me, and the verse:
